Our Armed Services Committee is proud to announce our Club's military commitment for this year. We will be supporting activities for Honor Flight Nevada. We will also be helping with the wives and families of Blue Star Moms. What an honor it is to be serving and supporting these wonderful causes!

The Washoe Republican Women will be hosting Mr. Jon Yuspa, coordinator of Honor Flight Nevada (www.honorflightnv.org) at the February luncheon. Below is an excerpt from the Honor Flight website summarizing the mission and achievements of the organization since its founding in 2005.

"The mission of Honor Flight is to transport America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials dedicated to honoring those who have served and sacrificed for our country.

The Honor Flight Network is a national network comprised of independent Hubs working together in furtherance of the Honor Flight mission. In furtherance of this common goal, we have the opportunity to show our nation's veterans the appreciation and honor they deserve. Participation in an Honor Flight trip gives veterans the opportunity to share this momentous occasion with other comrades, to remember friends and comrades lost, and share their stories and experiences with other veterans. All honored veterans travel at no cost to the veteran. The Honor Flight Network is currently serving veterans from the WWII, Korean War and Vietnam War eras."

The Honor Flight Network was cofounded in 2005 by Earl Morse, the son of a Korean and Vietnam War veteran, and Jeff Miller, a small business owner and son of a WWII veteran. As of 2019 there are more than 140 Honor Flight Network hubs. They have escorted well over 200,000 veterans to their respective memorials, at no cost to them.

Celebrating The 19th Amendment in Nevada



The Office of the Secretary of State is proud to align with the **Nevada Commission for Women** as we prepare to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the signing of the 19th Amendment. Join us in the State Capitol building on **February 7th, 2020** for a re-enactment ceremony which will include Governor Steve Sisolak, Secretary of State Barbara K. Cegavske, Assemblywoman Maggie Carlton, Assemblymen Jason Frierson and others recreating the scene of Governor Boyle ratifying the 19th Amendment, making Nevada the 28th state to do so.



JO Marshall Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Jo Marshall Memorial Scholarship Fund was created in 2001 in memory of Jo Marshall, who was a Boulder City RW - BOD, Past President and NvFRW Southern Director.

Two \$1,000.00 scholarships will be awarded, one to a Northern Nevada applicant and one to a Southern Nevada applicant. Female, Republican students attending a Nevada institute of Higher Learning are eligible to apply for a scholarship.

Funding for these scholarships is provided by the designated \$100.00 donations given directly to the scholarship fund by each club.

Each NvFRW club president may submit a maximum of two (2) sponsored applications. All applications must be received by the Jo Marshall Scholarship Chair by September 1, 2020. The scholarships will be awarded on or before October 1, 2020.

Jo Marshall Scholarship Guidelines/Criteria for an Application

Applicant Criteria for Consideration

- Must be a female resident of Nevada and a registered Republican
- Must be enrolled as a "degree seeking" student in her Sophomore, Junior, or Senior year, or as a Graduate Student at a Nevada Institute of Higher Learning
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and have carried 12 credit hours in the semester prior to September 1, 2019
- Must be sponsored by a NvFRW Club and the application signed by the President and/or First Vice President of the sponsoring Club (Each club may submit a maximum of two sponsored applications for consideration)

Applicant's Responsibilities for consideration

- Must submit two letters of recommendation from non-relatives
- Must submit a biographical essay describing a significant achievement and a time when the applicant grew as a person
- Must submit the most recent official university transcript available and proof of current registration
