


Joseph Lombardo, sheriff of Clark County, Nevada, the head of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department the combined law enforcement agency for Las Vegas and Clark County. He is a member of the Republican Party. Lombardo is not running for re-election as Clark County Sheriff and is instead running for Nevada Governor in 2022. Lombardo served in the U.S. Army, he became an LVMPD officer in 1988. In October 2011, Lombardo became the assistant sheriff in charge of the law enforcement services group, which included the department's divisions in charge of technical services, information technology, radio systems and professional standards. Lombardo holds a B.S. in civil engineering, and a master's degree in crisis management, both from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

membership and approved unanimously.






