Americanism by Jane Hillerby The Boston Massacre/ Tea Party

What was the impetus for the Boston Tea Party? Was it caused by taxes levied by the British Parliament? Or something else? You decide...

The British government had sent soldiers to Boston in 1768 to enforce the Townshend Act, a series of taxes on tea, paint, paper and other goods that it had imposed on the colonies the previous year. Many Bostonians resented the presence of the troops, and crowds regularly harassed British soldiers.

On the night of the massacre, a mob of about sixty protestors accosted a squad of troops near the Boston customs office. Jeering and chanting slogans against the British, they began throwing ice and snowballs at the men and daring them to fire. Unfortunately, one of the soldiers did. In the melee that followed, five of the protestors were killed. Patriot leaders in Boston immediately branded the event a "massacre" and seized on the shootings to inflame public opinion against the British, the city of Boston teetered on the brink of outright rebellion.

After the massacre, Parliament cut some of the controversial taxes, but not the duty on tea. Outraged, the patriots launched a successful boycott that resulted in huge losses for the British East India Company, the major exporter of tea to the colonies. Parliament again responded with the Tea Act which gave this exporter permission to bring tea directly to the colonies without paying taxes. Again the colonists were outraged, this time across all 13 colonies, and when ships of tea arrived at the port of Boston, no buyer was willing to unload them.

On December 16, 1773, members of a shadowy patriot group called Sons of Liberty, dressed up like Mohawk Indians, boarded three ships and dumped 342 crates of tea into the Atlantic Ocean, one of the most famous acts of civil disobedience in American history.

When news of the Boston Tea Party reached London, King George III was furious. Parliament retaliated by closing Boston's port until the cost of the tea was repaid and dispatched more redcoats to the unruly city. Ships carrying East India tea also arrived in Philadelphia and New York in 1773. Both captains returned their cargo to England rather than risk the wrath of the local patriot mobs. That year the British East India Company recorded 17 million pounds of unpurchased tea piled up in its warehouses in England

Protect Our Girls Initiative

In Nevada, a girl as young as 9 can get an abortion without a parent knowing. The Nevada Legislature has lacked the will or the numbers to fix this loophole in law that benefits abortionists and abusers and hurts children and those who love and know them best. Two statutory initiatives were filed in February to restore parents rights in all healthcare treatments. Children do not have the ability or maturity to consent to life-changing medical treatments, yet more and more, we are seeing the government and special interests like Planned Parenthood, cutting parents out.

S-03-2022, Protect Our Girls Initiative will require one parent notification prior to minor girls obtaining an abortion. S-04-2022, Protect Our Kids Initiative, guarantees parents have rights to access their minor child's medical records and restores parental consent to all healthcare decisions.

In 2020, as the originating women's club, Washoe Republican Women led the charge defending parents' rights, and, today, the club continues to shepherd this important effort.


